


ABOUT CENOVUS

We're a Canadian-based integrated energy company headquartered in Calgary. We're committed to maximizing value by developing our assets in a safe, innovative and cost-efficient manner, integrating environmental, social and governance considerations into our business plans.

We operate in Canada, the United States and the Asia Pacific region. Our operations include oil sands projects in northern Alberta, thermal and conventional crude oil and natural gas projects across Western Canada, crude oil production offshore Newfoundland and Labrador and natural gas and liquids production offshore China and Indonesia. Cenovus's downstream operations include upgrading, refining and marketing operations in Canada and the United States. On January 1, 2021 Cenovus Energy acquired Husky Energy, which started in 1938 with a small U.S. refinery, moving it to Lloydminster and starting a Canadian energy success story. Today, Cenovus is one of Canada's largest integrated oil and natural gas producers and refiners.

Our shares trade under the symbol CVE, and are listed on the Toronto and New York stock exchanges.

LLOYDMINSTER OPERATIONS

In the Lloydminster region, we rely on the energy of thousands of workers to keep our oil production, pipeline and storage and refinery operations running safely and reliably. Our people contribute their hard work and technical knowledge to produce oil that is the foundation for products we use every day, as well as the fuels and asphalt roads that keep Canadians moving.

Cenovus has a large upstream, midstream and downstream operation in Lloydminster, which makes it easy to have a long and successful career with us.

LLOYDMINSTER WORKFORCE

• We offer a variety of roles from lab scientists, engineers, process operators and many other positions, including Director level, with over **1,300 employees and contractors**.

LLOYDMINSTER UPGRADER

Opened: 1992

Our upgrader was commissioned in 1992 and processes heavy oil from our Lloydminster thermal projects. The synthetic crude produced at this upgrader is also used in the production of gasoline and diesel fuels in refineries in Canada and the U.S.

We're employing innovative technologies to produce high-quality products for North American markets.

LLOYDMINSTER REFINERY

Opened: 1947

As Western Canada's largest producer of paving asphalt, our Lloydminster Refinery produces more than 30 different types and grades of road asphalt from heavy oil. It uses modern technologies to produce:

- Highway-grade asphalt.
- Road oils used for dust control.
- A kerosene distillate.
- Gas oil which is processed at the Lloydminster Upgrader into low-sulphur diesel and Husky Synthetic Blend.





LLOYDMINSTER THERMALS

Started: 1981

Our thermal facilities include 12 heavy oil producing assets using steam-assisted gravity drainage (SAGD) technology, and pipelines in the region that transport oil from our field locations to our upgrader and asphalt refinery and other Cenovus assets.

LLOYDMINSTER CONVENTIONAL HEAVY OIL

Started: 1926

We have historically used cold heavy oil production with sand (called CHOPS) and enhanced oil recovery (EOR) production technologies in our heavy oil operations in Alberta and Saskatchewan. We continue to evolve our drilling and well technologies to access more resource.

HUSKY MIDSTREAM GENERAL PARTNERSHIP* (HMGP)

Started: 1963

On behalf of HMGP, Cenovus operates strategic pipeline connections, terminals and ancillary infrastructure in Alberta and Saskatchewan, including approximately 2,300 kilometres of pipeline in the Lloydminster region, 230,000+ barrels per day of pipeline throughput and 5.9 million barrels of storage capacity at Hardisty. The midstream business serves over 60 customers and is the exclusive blender for Western Canadian Select (WCS). Learn more about HMGP.

While Cenovus is the largest employer in Lloydminster, there are ample career opportunities in the greater region.



Lloydminster is also well known for its annual events, such as the Canadian Professional Chuckwagon Association Finals, Professional Bull Riders Winter Classic, craft fairs, a sport and leisure show along with many multi-cultural events, and every two years, the city plays host to the Lloydminster Heavy Oil Show.

HOUSING MARKET

Buying a home in Lloydminster is more affordable than in the larger cities. Residents have a range options from neighbourhoods with single-person dwellings and family homes to homes on spacious acreages all within a quick commute to city conveniences or outdoor recreation.

EDUCATION & TRAINING

Residents of Lloydminster enjoy a range of education and training opportunities from public school and Catholic education to post-secondary. Both the Lloydminster Public and Catholic school divisions offer French immersion that allows students to learn and develop in French.

Lloydminster Public School Division

The Lloydminster Public School Division has five elementary schools, one kindergarten to Grade 9 school, two middle schools, one high school and one outreach school. All schools offer students a well-rounded education with excellent instruction based on curricula provided by the Saskatchewan Ministry of Education. Students also benefit from extensive co-curricular and extracurricular opportunities. A French immersion program is also offered.





- **Business:** Whenever possible, we include local Indigenous-owned businesses in our supply chain.
